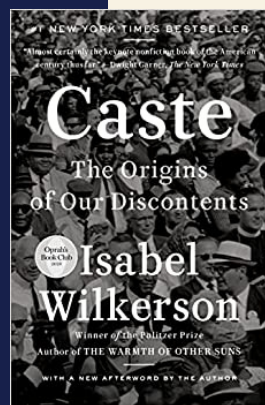

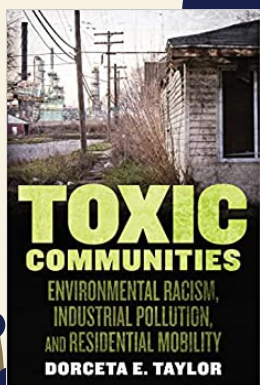
## Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents

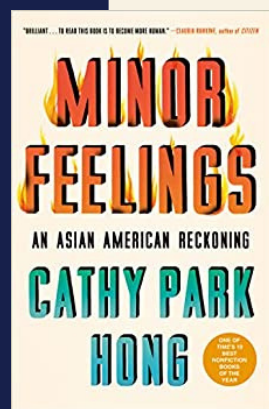
## Toxic Communities: Environmental Racism, Industrial Pollution, and Residential Mobility

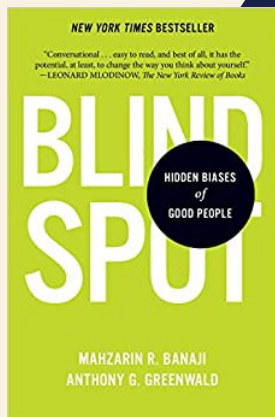
## Minor Feelings: An Asian American Reckoning

by Cathy Park Hong - A memoir that explores the experiences of Asian Americans in the United States and challenges the model minority myth.



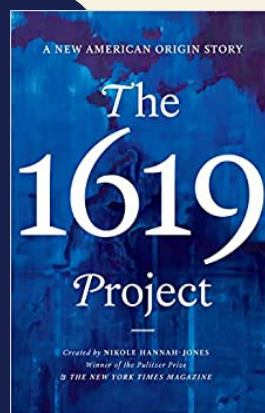
## Blindspot: Hidden Biases of Good People
